Colossians 3:16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.



Who is God? What is He like? Can He be known? These are the most important questions in the universe. The good news is God has answered these questions by revealing Himself through His attributes. The most important thing we can do in the universe is grow in our knowledge of God. We have been created by God to know God. For the season of Lent our devotions will be on knowing God through His attributes.

### **Patient**

Why are we saved? Because God is patient. Why has Jesus not yet returned? Because God is patient. God knows the beginning from the end so He doesn't have to be patient with things or events. When we speak of the patience of God, we are talking about His longsuffering toward people. God is longsuffering with sinners even when they provoke Him to no end.

The patience of God controls His sovereign plan and His perfect timing. The patience of God calms His righteous anger and makes forgiveness possible.

Patience has been called the neglected attribute of God, and our faith is impoverished because of it. The Father is infinitely patient. The Son of God is endlessly patient. The Holy Spirit is immeasurably patient.

## Scripture on God being patient/longsuffering

- *Numbers* 14:18 *The Lord is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, forgiving iniquity and transgression.*
- Numbers 9:17 They refused to obey and were not mindful of the wonders that you performed among them, but they stiffened their neck and appointed a leader to return to their slavery in Egypt. But you are a God ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and did not forsake them.
- *Psalm 86:15* But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.
- *Isaiah 30:18* Therefore the Lord waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the Lord is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for him.
- *Joel 2:13 Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster.*
- Jonah 4:2 Jonah prayed to the Lord and said, "O Lord, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster.
- **Romans 2:4** Do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?

- **Romans 12:19** Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."
- *I Timothy 1:16* I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life.
- II Peter 3:8-9, 15 But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. <sup>9</sup> The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. <sup>15</sup> And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the wisdom given him.
