Colossians 3:16

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.



Who is God? What is He like? Can He be known? These are the most important questions in the universe. The good news is God has answered these questions by revealing Himself through His attributes. Since the beginning of Lent we have had 19 devotionals on the attributes of God. We come now to the final attribute, **the glory of God**.

Glory

What is glory? What is the difference between God's glory and His holiness. Holiness is the greatest of God's many attributes, His crowning attribute. He is holy, set apart, completely other. Glory is the sum of all His attributes. Glory is the brilliant radiance produced by the infinite combination of all His attributes. God's glory outshines ten thousand suns.

God's glory is like a stained-glass window. Each piece of glass is like an attribute, piece of His character and nature, and all of it together is a stunningly beautiful, brilliant light. God's glory is what you see when His light shines through all that He is and has. God's glory is the revelation of all His attributes, of which holiness is His greatest. We are created for His glory, to behold His glory and to glorify Him.

Scripture on God's Glory

Psalm 8:1 O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens.

Psalm 19:1 The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork.

Psalm 57:5 Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let your glory be over all the earth!

Psalm 72:18-19 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, who alone does wondrous things.

19 Blessed be his glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with his glory!

Psalm 96:1-9 Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth!

- ² Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day.
- ³ Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples!
- ⁴ For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods.
- ⁵ For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the Lord made the heavens.
- ⁶ Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary.
