The Names of God.

This side of Heaven, it is impossible for our finite human minds to fully comprehend God's infinite, holy, awe-inspiring nature. We can only know about God what He chooses to reveal about Himself. In Scripture He reveals Himself to us through His attributes and through His names. We considered God's attributes earlier this year, so now we begin a series on the names of God.

Yahweh ~ The Self-Existent One

Yahweh (YHWH in Hebrew) is the personal, covenant name of Israel's God. It permeates the Old Testament over 6,800 times. It is first used in Genesis 2:4 but it is revealed by God as His personal name to Moses in Exodus 3:14-15 when God says, "I AM that I AM." The root meaning is "to be" meaning God's self-existence. This name teaches us God is personal, present, faithful, sovereign and good.

To the Jews Yahweh is the most intensely sacred name of God, the holiest of all His names and was held in such high esteem as to never be spoken aloud (Exodus 20:7). They would use other names in speaking.

In our English Bibles the word Yahweh is translated with LORD (notice the all capitals). When we read Lord, it is a different name for God (Adonai). Jehovah is another word for Yahweh.

Scripture for God as Yahweh

Genesis 2:4 These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens.

Exodus 3:13-14 Then Moses said to God, "If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I am who I am." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'I am has sent me to you.'" God also said to Moses, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.' This is my name forever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations.

Exodus 20:7 You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

Deuteronomy 4:35, 39 To you it was shown, that you might know that the LORD is God; there is no other besides him.

³⁹ know therefore today, and lay it to your heart, that the LORD is God in heaven above and on the earth beneath; there is no other.
