The Names of God.

This side of Heaven, it is impossible for our finite human minds to fully comprehend God's infinite, holy, awe-inspiring nature. We can only know about God what He chooses to reveal about Himself. In Scripture He reveals Himself to us through His attributes and through His names. We considered God's attributes earlier this year, so now we begin a series on the names of God.

King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

When God revealed Himself to Moses it was as Yahweh. When God revealed Himself to the nation of Israel it was as King (Exodus 15:18). This name includes the meaning of captain, master, ruler, chief, prince and lord. In the tabernacle and temple God was enthroned over the Ark of the Covenant between the cherubim.

Isaiah 37:16 O LORD of hosts, God of Israel, enthroned above the cherubim, you are the God, you alone, of all the kingdoms of the earth; you have made heaven and earth.

Yesterday, May 13, was Ascension Day, 40 days after the resurrection and 10 days before Pentecost, when Jesus ascended back into heaven and is seated on the throne at the right hand of the Father. He also shares the name and title, King of kings and Lord of lords.

Reflections in Scripture on Jesus' Ascension to the Throne as King of kings and Lord of lords.

Luke 24:50-53

Jesus led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. ⁵¹ While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. ⁵² And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, 53 and were continually in the temple blessing God.

Philippians 2:9-11

Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Romans 8:34

Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

Philippians 3:20-21

But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.

Colossians 3:1-4

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.
