The Names of God.

This side of Heaven, it is impossible for our finite human minds to fully comprehend God's infinite, holy, awe-inspiring nature. We can only know what God chooses to reveal about Himself. In Scripture He reveals Himself to us through His attributes and through His names. We considered God's attributes earlier this year, now we consider the names of God.

Lord God Almighty (El Shaddai)

After Yahweh, this is the next great title by which God has revealed Himself to us. We often think of God as Almighty but we don't often think of Him as a Mighty Warrior, but that is how Israel thought of Him. El Shaddai or Shaddai occurs about 50 times in the OT. God first reveals Himself by this title to Abraham in Genesis 17 and Jacob in Genesis 35. And of course there is the famous theophany in Joshua 5.

God is mighty in His sovereignty able to do whatever He purpose to do. God's strength is perfect, it cannot be added to or diminished and no one can keep Him from accomplish His purposes. What look like setbacks to us are all apart of His plan. He will save all who trust in Him. Be confident and thankful today that He will certainly accomplish His will.

Reflections from Scripture on the Lord God Almighty (El Shaddai).

Genesis 17:1-2 When Abram was ninety-nine years old the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless, that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly."

Genesis 35:9-11 God appeared to Jacob again, when he came from Paddan-aram, and blessed him. And God said to him, "Your name is Jacob; no longer shall your name be called Jacob, but Israel shall be your name." So he called his name Israel. And God said to him, "I am God Almighty: be fruitful and multiply. A nation and a company of nations shall come from you, and kings shall come from your own body.

Joshua 5:13-15 When Joshua was by Jericho, he lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, a man was standing before him with his drawn sword in his hand. And Joshua went to him and said to him, "Are you for us, or for our adversaries?" And he said, "No; but I am the commander of the army of the Lord. Now I have come." And Joshua fell on his face to the earth and worshiped and said to him, "What does my lord say to his servant?" And the commander of the LORD 's army said to Joshua, "Take off your sandals from your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy." And Joshua did so.
