The History of the Organ at First CRC

(Edited from the 100-year history of First CRC written by Ron DeValois)

1913. In the second decade of its existence, First CRC showed evidence of prosperous times. In 1913, the church purchased a six-rank Hinners organ for \$1200. Barney Bajema and Herman Elenbaas installed the tracker model and its facade. Rev. Hoekenga was pleased to have the organ accompany the singing of the Dutch Psalms. Up to this time a "voor zanger" (a foresinger) initiated the congregational singing. The organ console was behind the pulpit. At first the organ had to be manually pumped to supply air. On rare occasion, the bellows operator fell asleep during the sermon. So when the organist played the final psalm, there was no sound. Sometime in the 1920s an electric blower replaced the bellows operator. There were 7 ranks, 372 pipes, 2 manuals, 7 stops, and 7 registers.

1950s. After 40 years, in the mid-1950s, the Hinners organ gave the organists difficulties as it showed its age and the moving parts no longer moved freely. Balcom and Vaughn Organ Company of Seattle refurbished the instrument in 1957. The speaking pipes in the facade were disconnected and three new ranks were added. The console and its system levers were removed. The new console stood by itself in the area where the deacons once sat, and the instrument operated electrically. The new arrangement allowed the organists to have eye contact with the minister and the congregation. There were 8 ranks, 512 pipes, 3 divisions, 2 manuals, 8 stops, and 15 registers.

1980s. In the 1980s the Hinners organ with the Balcom and Vaughn additions showed signs of wear. Electrical relays failed resulting in no sound or unwanted sound and keys stuck. The organ committee recommended a major rebuild of the instrument. While many churches at this time were replacing their pipe organs with electronic organs, First CRC had the vision to install an excellent pipe organ. The congregation approved the \$127,000 project and contributed generously. Casavant Freres of St.

2021. The council accepted the generous donation from the Hollander family to add to our organ a larger Swell division consisting of 12 ranks of about 800 pipes behind the west facade. Also donated was a three manual solid state Schantz console. The new division was installed by Marceau & Associates Pipe Organ Builders in Seattle and completed in September 2021. A special organ dedication recital was held on October 14, 2021, with Michael Plagerman. There are 32 ranks, 1,828 pipes, 4 divisions, 3 manuals, and 26 stops.
