out of sheer grace, God grants and credits to me the perfect satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of Christ, as if I had never sinned nor been a sinner, as if I had been as perfectly obedient as Christ was obedient for me. All I need to do is to accept this gift of God with a believing heart.

Why do you say that by faith alone you are right with God?

It is not because of any value my faith has that God is pleased with me.

Only Christ's satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness make me right with God.

And I can receive this righteousness and make it mine in no other way than by faith alone.
